Land Acknowledgement

The Halifax Hawks Minor Hockey Association acknowledges that we play hockey on Mi'kma'ki, the unceded and ancestral territory of the Mi'kmaq people. This territory is covered by the "Treaties of Peace and Friendship" which Mi'kmaq and Wolastoqiyik (Maliseet) Peoples first signed with the British Crown in 1725. We are all treaty people.

The Halifax Hawks recognize that our past includes a misrepresentation of an indigenous person's likeness, without permission or consultation as a logo, and we acknowledge this may have caused harm. We commit to continuing to take steps towards reconciliation and making hockey a safe and inclusive game for all.

Goals:

- Provide an updated policy manual for review and approval.
- Create a Halifax Hawks Land acknowledgement statement to be published on Association website and included in ceremonial and public documents.
- Create and publish tools and resources for promoting respect and civility in the game and communicate expectations and processes for responding to behaviour contrary to the Associations' values and rules.



Safety Results:

- ➤ 2-deep policy commitment: At the direction/requirement by HNS the Hawks committed to the high standard required. A big thank you to all team staff who supported this initiative.
- The VP, Risk also guided and led the Association, with full cooperation through a judicial process in relation to historic and abhorrent incidents that we condemn.
- An "In the moment directive" was created as part of the new DEI policy in an effort to create positive support for coaches/players when they witness a rule 11 violation.



Conduct/Safety Results continued:

- Hawks Code of Conduct stats:
 - Code of Conduct Committee
 - Committee activated three (3) times.
 - Sanctions included suspensions, educational sanctions, & a forfeited game.
 - Appeals committee
 - Engaged One (1) time appeal abandoned.
 - HNS rendered suspensions against:
 - 25 Hawks players for a total of 66 games plus 1 indefinite suspension.
 - 2 Hawk's coaches for a total of 13 games.

 Acknowledgement, which was also approved by the Mi'kmaq Sports Council.
