It also causes kids to become more aggressive in their remaining hawks practices as I witnessed this first hand on a couple ice sessions that I ran.

• C Level Teams – Overall the vibe was all positive with our C teams. While some struggled out of the gate, improvements were made and the re classifying of teams always helps smooth the season out for all. Our U11 Royals made the bronze medal finals, Our U13C Ice Hawks lost a close 2-1 bronze semi final game to the eventual winners, both the Sea Hawks and Black Hawks made the semi finals of the silver division in U13 and the Red Hawks won the U15C Bronze championship.

• Competitive Team Success

Our U11 AA teams pulled off a feat that probably won't be completed again in a very long time, with both teams finishing 1-2 in regular season and meeting in the CMHF playoff finals. It was an amazing achievement for our teams and many thanks to the coaches of both teams. Our U11 A and B teams were fairly young this yr and struggled in the wins and losses column but they showed improvement throughout the year and a lot of these players will move up next yr in the U11 age group. As you can see below, if enrollment stays the same next yr, we will be right around the cusp of 110 registered in the U11 division.

Our U13 teams all showed great improvement over the course of the year. The AAA team, while falling in round 1 of playoffs, had an exceptional season finishing 5th overall and just 2 pts out of third. They did this while introducing 3 players to the defense position for the first time. Our AA, A and B teams all peaked at the right time of the year and had strong showings in the provincial playdowns and league playoffs. Our U13A team in particular really showed exceptional improvements from start to finish this season, narrowly missing out on provincial qualifying and playoff success. Between the returning U13 players and the incoming group of U11 players, I think our U13 division should be in a good position next year but may not realize some real success until the following season

Our U15 division saw some real success this season with our U15AA team winning the provincial championship, our U15A team capturing the the regular season title, and qualifying for the day of champions final game. Our two B teams were well balanced, finishing with almost identical records in regular season and playoffs. Both teams were very competitive. Our U15 division was really helped by very strong goaltending on every team this season. It was a strong point for the division.

Our U18 AA team struggled this season. Attendance and lack of players to choose from for tryouts were some of the causes to this. We are hopeful that a strong graduating U15 class will revive the U18 program but we will need to take a wait and see approach as High School tryouts and U16 Minor may affect this group.

Overall this was the most successful season on ice in recent memory for the Hawks with many banners won and the majority of our teams being very competitive in league and tournament play.
